What to Do

Be alert during local large gatherings, such as conventions, sporting events, and hunting seasons

Do not confront, seek help

Notify the manager on duty, who can follow your establishment's policies

Make note of date and time of suspected trafficking

Who to Call

If suspected trafficking is observed, please contact local law enforcement

Call 911 if the situation you are witnessing is an emergency

GUESTS

- No luggage or belongings in a bag
- Rooms paid for in cash, frequent short stays
- Anyone who appears fearful, submissive, disoriented, malnourished, injured
- Anyone who appears to be controlled by someone
- No name, address or vehicle information, lacks identification
- Rents room hourly, or for abnormally long period of time, attempts to pay with cash or reloadable gift cards, has local address, and frequent short stays

VISITORS

- High level of calls to a room or people calling who don't know guest's name
- "Friend" or "relative" visiting who cannot provide guest's name or other identifying information
- Visitors go to a room for 30 minutes to an hour regularly
- Visitors dropped off by someone who waits in car outside
- A minor accompanying a guest after check-in, or with a guest at odd hours

HOTEL AREAS

- People loitering/soliciting in common areas, lobby, or hallways
- People appearing to monitor common areas
- Use of hotel computers to visit adult websites
